Thank you for your enquiry about the Commission's work on limiting double taxation in the EU, which Mrs Carlin has passed on to me. Your refer to the problems that you and other Danish residents in France face owing to the double taxation of their Danish pensions.

I am happy to inform you that on 11 November last the Commission adopted a Communication on possible ways to address double taxation of both individual and corporate taxpayers within the EU, with a view to evaluating and subsequently presenting possible solutions in 2012.
